"Amen, I say to you, this poor widow put in more than all the other contributors to the treasury. For they have all contributed from their surplus wealth, but she, from her poverty, has contributed all she had, her whole livelihood." Mark 12: 43-44

Today Jesus remarks on the offering of the widow to the temple treasury in Jerusalem. In the temple, precincts there were thirteen trumpet shaped chests that were designated for different needs of the temple. Since coins were the primary form of money donations would make noise as they were deposited into the chest. The larger the donation, the more numerous and heavy the coins, and the more noise they made when deposited.

The two small coins the Widow gives to the temple are two Jewish Leptas that are worth one Roman Quadran. A Quadran is a quarter of an As. Sixteen Asses equals a Denarius. A Denarius is the rough equivalent of a daily wage for a day laborer. Thus, the Widow's two coins equals 1.5% of a daily wage for a day laborer. At this time in Israel, widows had no inheritance rights. Widows and orphans are depicted in the Old Testament as the poorest and most in need.

Jesus knows that the Widow gives to the temple out of love of God. What seems foolish and unwise to the worldly is love and devotion in the eyes of the Lord. This woman's devotion is more pleasing to God "than a thousand fat lambs" in sacrifice. Would that same love and devotion be in the other people Jesus observes giving to the temple treasury? What more could God do with such faith and love for them and for others! The worldly might feel sorry for the Widow but the faithful should feel admiration and awe for her. For this widow knows and understands the ways of God and willingly entrusts her life to God.

There is a parallel with Jesus. Jesus is just days away from his Crucifixion. Jesus is a gift from God the Father to his people. The widow's faith makes her among those who are able to receive no greater treasure than God himself into her life. Because her true faith will not be denied by God. Might we be so bold and trusting this week to make a generous offering of ourselves to God out of love for God and the desire to be pleasing in no other eyes but His.

This month is a busy time for the Dominicans. Last Sunday, Fr. Pius and Br. Columban were in Glennallen at Holy Family Church. Fr. Dominic returns late tonight (Saturday evening) from ministry in Fairbanks. On Sunday, Br. Columban will be doing Communion services in Talkeetna and Trapper Creek. I will be in Wasilla at Sacred Heart Parish to cover the Masses for Fr. Joseph McGilloway who is on vacation. Next weekend Fr. Dominic will be at St. Theresa's Camp for the Holy Rosary Academy student retreat and Fr. Pius will be in Talkeetna and Trapper Creek. Please keep us in your prayers for safe travels and prayerful celebrations of the Eucharist!
